## Retailers to step up hiring this year as industry expands

**M**ore than half of Indian retailers are planning to enhance their hiring this year, according to a report by staffing and recruitment firm GI Group.

In 2023, the retail industry experienced an 8% rise in job applications, while demand surged by 18%, indicating a strong hiring momentum.

The data also reflects the rapid expansion by off-trade players. For instance, gross leasing stood at 2.8 square feet in the first half of FY24, compared with 2.56 square feet in the same period last year.

This was driven by retailers confirming their expansion across tier-I and tier-II towns, according to the report.

The report anticipates this distribution pattern to hold through 2024, reflecting the high inflow of applicants.

Hiring trends are the strongest in categories such as electronics and gadgets, followed by beauty and personal care, fashion and lifestyle.

Meanwhile, the logistics sector faced a 13.8% decline in active job roles during the December quarter, attributed to challenges during peak season fulfillment.

However, the onset of 2024 has seen a significant increase in new job postings, with projections of continued growth leading up to this year's peak season, it said.

The beauty retail segment, requiring more staff, also saw a 15% rise in job applications, while demand surged by 18%.

GI Group's report also signalled a significant upturn in hiring trends in the food and beverage sectors as more shoppers turn to delivery platforms during the pandemic lockdowns.
